# EXAMPLE 1 - restaurant 1



Have you ever eaten in the middle of a butcher shop? At this place, that's exactly what you'll do. The owner, an exceptional butcher who supplies Michelin-starred restaurants, has set up three tables in his butcher shop where 16 people can enjoy the meat he selects, matures, slices and grills.

In addition to the extensive menu covering different cuts of veal, beef, lamb and pork, such as a beautiful milk-fed veal chop and a wonderful beef tenderloin, you can also order a piece from the butchery if you've seen something that tickles your fancy. Each meat comes with two sides (which could be a meal on their own, for example if you have a vegetarian in your group) brought to you by the warm and caring team. It's a unique experience.

# EXAMPLE 2 - restaurant 2



This shoebox of a restaurant excels at market cuisine with foreign influences. That's because, despite its size, it has not one but two great chefs, who flambé miso-marinated beef, fry quail in karaage batter, roast turnips in butter, braise mussels with coriander and peanuts, and toss blanched leeks with feta vinaigrette. That the restaurant has remained an insider's tip is a minor miracle, probably due to the fact that it is hiding in a decentralized residential neighborhood. Like any good neobistro worth its salt, it serves a fine selection of natural wines with its five-course menus that will send your taste buds on a wild journey.

# EXAMPLE 5 - boutique
